Participation in professional activities

Over the past five years, I have presented my research at several conferences in the United States and Japan. I have also presented at various organizations including U.S. Department of State Foreign Service Institute (Yokohama), the Center for Japanese Studies, and the Hawaiian Historical Society. I am currently an executive committee member for the Center for Japanese Studies and regularly serve as a member of various departmental committees (admissions, assessment, awards, faculty search, etc.). In Spring 2015, I was the interim graduate chair.

Publications

Over the past five years, I authored articles on East Asian film, the Japanese exodus from Manchuria following WWII, outrigger canoes, and an encounter in 1840 between Japanese castaways and Hawaiian pioneers on a remote Pacific archipelago called the Bonin Islands. My four published works have appeared in *The Hawaiian Journal of History*, *Journal of Northeast Asian History*, *Film History*, and *Kontentsu bunkashi kenkyū*. Two more articles are forthcoming.
